

BEER LIST for Guildford Beer Festival 2011

Andwell Brewery

- **Resolute Bitter 3.8**
“Light amber best bitter with balanced aromas & bitterness”
Taking its name from a town within the high Arctic, despite its cool name this is the sort of bitter that we’re sure you’ll easily warm to. Andwell’s Best Bitter combines the finest malt and hops to produce a well balanced malty and hoppy flavour with a light amber colour
- **Gold Muddler 3.9**
“Golden blonde ale with fresh taste and citrus aroma”
Named after a fishing fly used for luring trout, this Blonde Ale has a refreshing pallette due to the use of high quality pale ale malt. By blending different hops at various stages of the brewing process Andwell’s have produced a beautiful beer with a citrus aroma and balanced bitterness.
- **King John 4.2**
This Pale Ale takes its name from the castle built by King John in 1207, which is located less than one mile from the Brewery, and from where he rode out to Runnymede to sign the Magna Carta. The beer itself is deep amber in colour with a blend of pale ale and crystal malt. The bitterness and fruity aroma are developed from a combination of hops
- **Ruddy Darter 4.6**
“Rich ruby ale with a fruity aroma”
This ale is named after a deep red dragon fly found in local rivers and wetlands. The beer, the newest to the Andwell’s range, uses malted rye to create its characteristic ruby glow. The flavours and aromas derive from a combination of English hops.

Ascot Ales

- **Alley Cat 3.8**
Light copper ale packed full of flavour. Refreshing and hoppy with Brewers Gold hops giving gorgeous aromas of tropical and lemony fruits. A terrific session ale.
- **Alligator 4.6**
A golden ale with a wonderful hoppy nose from the Cascade Hops. Its fresh, crisp, true to style with light carbonation and floral hoppy notes
- **Anastasia 5.0**
Packed with chocolate and roasted coffee flavours, with a slight sherry like aroma. Further bittered to balance the sweetness of the malts, the beer has a unique hoppy aroma with orange, pine and resin flavours noticeable.
- **Posh Pooch 4.2**
Our flagship Bitter pours a rich copper colour with a sweet malt taste and toffee notes. This is perfectly balanced with a mix of Chinook and Cascade hops providing a sharp bitterness, with a strong citrus and tropical fruit aroma and some slight spicy hints.
- **On the Rails 3.8**
A dark ale with a sophisticated blend of malts combined with a distinctive hop character. A balance of caramel and chocolate flavours from the malt and a great aroma of pine and citrus from whole hop flowers makes this a memorable beer. It’s a session beer to savour.

Ballards

- **Best 4.2**
A copper coloured beer with a malty aroma. A good balance of fruit and malt gives a dry, hoppy aftertaste.
- **Midhurst Mild 4.3**
Classic, dark Mild. Lightly hopped and well malted throughout, without being sweet.
- **Golden Bine 3.8**
A lovely golden yellow beer with floral lemon fragrance and soft citrus flavours and a sharp dry finish. Brewed with Pearl malt and a touch of wheat, combined with Golding and Fuggle hops.
- **Nyewood Gold 5.0**
Auburn bronze Premium ale with malty barley sugar and spicy hop aromas and a smooth creamy flavour with soft fruits throughout with a tasty balanced finish.
Specially brewed for the Hop Growers Association “English Ale Awards” with single hop variety “Phoenix”, this beer won the Gold Medal. Gold in the Strong Bitter section of the Champion Beer of Britain Competition in 1999, was a category winner in the First Great Western October Fest 1998, and Bronze at the S.E. SIBA Regional Beer Competition 2007.

Dark Star

- **Espresso 4.2**
A black beer brewed with roasted barley malt and challenger hops. Then freshly ground Arabica coffee beans, blended especially for Dark Star, are added to the copper for a few minutes after the boil to provide a rich and complementary coffee aroma.
- **Hop Head 3.8**
An extremely clean-drinking pale golden ale with a strong floral aroma and elderflower notes from the Cascade hops. This beer is full-bodied and full-flavoured yet gentle enough to make it a favourite session beer.
- **Partridge Best 4.0**
A Best Bitter brewed in a traditional Sussex style using Maris Otter, Crystal and Chocolate malts with East Kent Golding hops. Typical of Dark Star ales, the Best Bitter relies on the heavy handed addition of aromatic hops late in the boil

Dorking Brewery

- **DB One 4.2**
A refreshing light amber ale with a full fruity, hoppy flavour and a long satisfying medium bitter finish"
- **Red India Ale 5.0**
Delicious - like hot buttered toast with hints of fruit cake, with a malty, caramel finish and a pleasing bitterness. Similar to an IPA - strong hoppy beer, red in colour. Best Ale of Festival 2010 Guildford Beer Festival.
- **Black Mild 3.5**
Made with 6 speciality grains, It's aroma and taste is of sweet roasted malt, coffee and lightly burnt caramel. With a creamy mouthfeel and low carbonation it's lightly hopped for a smoothly dry, bitter toffee finish.
- **Oatmeal Stout 4.5**
A delicious blend of malts provide this dark stout with a smooth finish, with coffee and caramel tastes being complemented by a hint of blackcurrent provided by Bramling Cross hops.

Havant Brewery

- **Started 4.0**
This very moreish session ale has a burnished copper colour. The taste is fresh and zingy with a strong malt overtone. The hops are Admiral for bitterness and Perle and Cascade for aroma. Pale, Crystal and Amber malts give depth.
- **Stopped Dancing 4.4**
Golden summer ale, light in character. This is a hoppy ale with fresh cut grass and hedgerow qualities, leaving a nice dry after taste that invites you to take the next mouthful.
- **Finished 5.0**
Hampshire Beer of the Year 2009-10. The colour is that of conkers. The taste is of coffee and caramel derived from a complex malt profile of Pale, Chocolate, Crystal and Amber. Plus added Mollses. A classic combination of Goldings for bitterness and Fuggles and Goldings for aroma.

Hogs Back Brewery

- **TEA 4.2**
The brewery's flagship ale is pale brown, with a hoppy and slightly fruity aroma supported by malt in the taste. A well crafted, bittersweet beer with a long dry finish.
- **HBB 3.7**
A light amber session bitter, biscuit flavour with fragrant hops leading to subtle malty citrus fruits with a long, aromatic, hoppy finish with a light malty aftertaste.
- **Summer Ale 4.2**
The light straw coloured ale is ideal for those warm lazy summer days. With a refreshingly cool taste.
- **Hop Garden 4.6**
A malty, pale golden beer with hints of banana and pineapple, with a good balance of aroma and bittering hops giving a long dry finish with a sense of sweetness.

WJ King

- **South Downs Ale 5.1**
South Downs Ale has been brewed especially for the 18th Brighton and South Downs CAMRA Ale Trail which runs from 30th May until 30th September 2011.
South Downs Ale has a light, golden amber colour with a full head and great lacing on the glass as you drink through a refreshing pint.

There is a well balanced bitterness with hints of orange and citrus fruits lingering in the mouth. A very clean, fresh and distinctive malt finish. A full fruit flavour with a spicy character.

- **Horsham Best 3.8**
Horsham Best is a mid-brown coloured session bitter which has a wonderful aroma of caramel and roasted malt with a hint of smokiness and dried fruit. The beer has a smooth and full presence in the mouth, whilst the initial taste is of intense nutty, malt sweetness which gives way to a distinct smokiness imparted by the crystal and dark malts. This is followed by and balanced with a long lingering spicy, pine hinted aftertaste chockfull of English hops.
- **Summer Ale 4.1**
Summer Ale has a delightful, clean hop aroma balanced with the light malty flavour for a thirst quenching summer drink.
Brewed with the finest Pale Ale Marris Otter Malt and choicest Goldings Hops to produce a simple, refreshing summer beer.
- **Brighton Blonde 3.9**
Brighton Blonde is a golden, pale blonde ale which has a distinctive hoppy aroma derived from the use of Celeia hops late in the copper. The taste is sharply hoppy and beautifully stimulates the underside edges of your tongue. The merest hint of malt complements the hops, and the aftertaste develops the hops further with an increasing dryness and straw bitterness to the finish.
- **Red River 4.8**
Red River Ale is a premium bitter, good to its name, having an enticing reddish hue. The aroma has vine fruits with a hint of caramel toffee from the aromatic malt and a nod towards the hoppiness to come. Red River has a smooth, full mouth feel with an initial taste of almonds. There is a good malt and hop balance and just enough alcohol warmth for the strength. As the taste develops the hoppiness grows with a long lingering bitter aftertaste with hints of pine and spice.
- **IPA 5.2**
The deeper colour of this IPA is more reminiscent of the new world IPAs than the English IPAs but do not be fooled, this is a solidly English style IPA. There's orangey fruit on the nose and some distinct hops presaging flavours to come. The initial taste is well balanced between the malt and resinous hops but in the aftertaste the hops flavours build and the spicy hops develop such that this would be bold enough to stand up to and thereby compliment your Friday night spicy curry!

Langhams Brewery

- **Halfway to Heaven 3.5**
Auburn/chestnut colour. H2H is well balanced between crisp biscuity maltiness and a citrus and fruit hop character with a hint of bitterness in the finish
- **Hip Hop 4.0**
Following in the modern tradition of blonde strongly hopped beers. A classic blonde beer – clean and crisp. The nose is loaded with floral hop aroma while the pale malt flavour is overtaken by a pleasing dry and bitter finish.
- **Best 4.5**
A tawny–coloured classic best beer with well-balanced malt flavours, finished with a hint of blackcurrant and a slightly spicy, sweet aroma.
- **Langham Special Draught 5.3**
An auburn beer with rich complex flavours and a deep red glow. The sweet maltiness is balanced with spicy hop aromas and a dry finish. Definitely a pint to savour.

Pilgrim Brewery

- **Surrey Bitter 3.7**
An easy drinking but full bodied bitter amber in colour hopped with Worcester Goldings and Bohemian Styrians.
- **Crusader 4.9**
One of the original Golden bitters first brewed when we moved to Reigate in 1985, light on the palate, good condition with a pronounced aromatic hop character.
- **Silver Sovereign 4.5**
Created in 2007 to celebrate our 25th anniversary. Brewed with Vienna malt and Sovereign hops.

Rebellion Beer Co

- **IPA 3.7**
A copper coloured, easy drinking beer, with considerable depth and complexity. A well balanced malt & fruit flavour continues to a long, refreshing & crisp finish
- **Blonde 4.3**

Brewed using only pale and lager malts, giving the beer a very light golden colour. A thirst quenching alternative to lager, whilst maintaining the quality of real ale.

- **Smuggler 4.1**
An amber coloured best bitter, offering an initial smoothness followed by a dry aftertaste along with a fruity hop aroma.
- **Mutiny 4.5**
A reddish, full bodied premium ale, with a rich malty flavour & a lasting, hoppy & bittersweet finish.

Surrey Hills

- **Shere Drop 4.2**
The flagship beer is pale in colour with a subtle hint of grapefruit and lemon in the aroma. The wonderful hop bitterness is complemented by a balanced malt flavour. The beer has a long finish, which is moderately dry.
- **Ranmore Ale 3.8**
A straw coloured extremely moreish session beer that has a surprisingly full flavour for its strength. A pleasant and distinctive aroma is followed by a moderate hop bitterness.
- **Green Sand IPA**
Highly hopped IPA with a wonderful hop aroma. The malt sweetness bravely attempts to balance the hop bitterness, with plenty of grapefruit and floral flavours.

Triple fff

- **Hallelujah 4.5**
Lager in colour full flavoured real ale with a rich fruit nose featuring New Zealand 'Green Bullet' hops to give a pine lemon crispness and increasing hoppiness toward the quenching bitter finish. Perfect for a warm evenings quaffing.
- **Dazed & Confused 4.6**
A pale amber ale, a complex bittersweet mixture of malt, hops and bitter fruit. Satisfying and full bodied, well balanced with a long hoppy finish and most popular seasonal.
- **Altons Pride 4.8**
After years of fine tuning, our vision for Alton's Pride is complete. A traditional amber bitter brewed using water from the Hampshire chalk hills. Full and clean tasting, initially malty then citrus fruit and resinous hop build to a quenching bitter finish.

Windsor & Eton

- **Guardsman Best Bitter 4.2**
Tangy copper-coloured best bitter with a fresh hop finish, smoothed by oak conditioning
- **Knight of the Garter Golden Ale 3.8**
Straw-coloured easy-drinking Golden Ale brewed with Amarillo hops for a distinctive citrus hop flavour
- **Conqueror Black IPA 5.0**
Black IPA brewed with five specialty malts and Cascade hops to give an intense combination of roast malt and pine hop flavours.
- **Windsor Knot – Royal Wedding Ale 4.0**
Originally produced for the Royal Wedding but retained due to demand, this contemporary bitter is brewed with Nelson Sauvignon hops for fantastic fruity flavour

Cider 146

- **Hampshire Heritage Cider 6.7**
This cider was known as just 146 Cider in 2010, this is a blend of cider and desert apples with a mellow tannin and back note of sharpness.
- **Wild West Cider 6.8**
New for 2010, this is a full western style of cider made from five cider varieties
- **Eastern Delight Cider 7.1**
New for 2010 (a limited stock), this is a traditional eastern style of cider made from only quality desert apples.

Mr Whitehead's Cider Company

- **Newtons Discovery 3.8**
A revival of a historical light and dry cider made for quaffing whilst you work the fields! At only 3.8% ABV you can keep your head and thirst at bay. This is made from many varieties of apple including Discovery.
- **Heart of Hampshire 6.0**
The mainstay of Mr. Whitehead's Cider Company. A traditional medium-dry cider with a light aftertaste and a golden colour. A respectable 6.0% ABV that deserves to be chilled for an optimum taste.
